

Declawing Facts: WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW



DECLAWING = Amputation of the end bones in the cat's toes

(imagine having to walk without the first toe bones)

COMMON COMPLICATIONS:

Litterbox Avoidance

(due to pain, cat uses carpets and soft furniture instead)

Infection / Abscess

Pain / Nerve Damage

Claw Regrowth

Bone Protrusion

Bone Splinter

Aggression / Stress Illness

Phantom Pain

Change in Personality

Biting / Depression

Chronic Back and Joint Pain

Lameness

Arthritis

Cystitis / Eczema

Instead, Train Your Cat!

- Use scratching posts and scratch pads. Discover what surfaces your cat likes best. Provide a variety throughout your home. Rub catnip on post and place at base to entice and engage kitty.
- Play with your cat on areas you want them to scratch to encourage their use. Praise with a treat!
- Use sticky tape and/or deterrent sprays to protect surfaces.
- Purchase Feliway pheromone spray to help reduce any stress.
- Keep cat's nails trimmed.
- Soft Paws, a temporary nail cover, is another alternative to explore (as a last resort, because if not applied correctly, infections can occur. We've found simply keeping the nails trimmed has the same benefit as Soft Paws).
